A BILL

- To direct the Director of National Intelligence to produce a National Intelligence Estimate on the situation in Afghanistan, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Afghanistan Security
- 5 Through Intelligence Act".

1SEC. 2. NATIONAL INTELLIGENCE ESTIMATE ON SECURITY2SITUATION IN AFGHANISTAN AND RELATED3REGION.

4 (a) REQUIREMENT.—The Director of National Intel5 ligence, acting through the National Intelligence Council,
6 shall produce a National Intelligence Estimate on the situ7 ation in Afghanistan and the covered region.

8 (b) MATTERS.—The National Intelligence Estimate 9 produced under subsection (a) shall include, with respect 10 to the 2-year period beginning on the date on which the 11 Estimate is produced, an assessment of the following:

12 (1) The presence in Afghanistan (including fi-13 nancial contributions to the Taliban, political rela-14 tions with the Taliban, military presence in the covered region, economic presence in the covered region, 15 16 and diplomatic presence in the covered region) of 17 China, Iran, Pakistan, Russia, and any other foreign 18 country determined relevant by the Director, respec-19 tively, and an assessment of the potential risks, or 20 benefits, of any such presence, contributions, or rela-21 tions.

(2) Any change in the threat to the United
States homeland or United States entities abroad as
a result of the withdrawal of the Armed Forces from
Afghanistan on August 31, 2021, including an assessment of the risk of al-Qaeda or any affiliates

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1	thereof, the Islamic State of Iraq and ash Sham-
2	Khorasan or any affiliates thereof, or any other
3	similar international terrorist group, using Afghani-
4	stan as a safe haven for launching attacks on the
5	United States and its interests abroad.
6	(3) The political composition and sustainability
7	of the governing body of Afghanistan, including an
8	assessment of the ability of the United States Gov-
9	ernment to influence the policies of such governing
10	body on the following:
11	(A) Counterterrorism.
12	(B) Counternarcotics.
13	(C) Human rights (particularly regarding
14	women and girls and traditionally targeted eth-
15	nic groups).
16	(D) The treatment and safe transit of Af-
17	ghans holding special immigrant visa status
18	under section 602 of the Afghan Allies Protec-
19	tion Act of 2009 (8 U.S.C. 1101 note) and
20	other Afghans who, during the period beginning
21	in 2001, assisted efforts of the United States in
22	Afghanistan or the covered region.
23	(4) The effect on the covered region, and Eu-
24	rope, of refugees leaving Afghanistan.

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(5) The commitments of the Taliban relating to counterterrorism, including an assessment of—

(A) whether such commitments required under the agreement entered into between the United States Government and the Taliban in February 2020, have been tested, or will be tested during the 2-year period covered by the Estimate, and what such commitments entail;

9 (B) whether any additional commitments 10 relating to counterterrorism agreed to by the 11 Taliban pursuant to subsequent negotiations 12 with the United States Government following 13 February 2020, have been tested, or will be 14 tested during the 2-year period covered by the 15 Estimate, and, if applicable, what such commit-16 ments entail;

(C) any benchmarks against which the Taliban are to be evaluated with respect to commitments relating to counterterrorism; and

(D) the intentions and capabilities of the Taliban with respect to counterterrorism (as such term is understood by the United States and by the Taliban, respectively), including the relations of the Taliban with al-Qaeda or any affiliates thereof, the Islamic State of Iraq and $\mathbf{5}$

ash Sham-Khorasan or any affiliates thereof, or
 any other similar international terrorist group.
 (c) SUBMISSION TO CONGRESS.—
 (1) SUBMISSION.—Not later than one year after

4 (1) SUBMISSION.—Not later than one year after
5 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Director
6 shall submit to the congressional intelligence com7 mittees the National Intelligence Estimate produced
8 under subsection (a), including all intelligence re9 porting underlying the Estimate.

10 (2) FORM.—The National Intelligence Estimate
11 shall be submitted under paragraph (1) in classified
12 form.

(d) PUBLIC VERSION.—Consistent with the protection of intelligence sources and methods, at the same time
as the Director submits to the congressional intelligence
committees the National Intelligence Estimate under subsection (c), the Director shall make publicly available on
the internet website of the Director an unclassified version
of the key findings of the National Intelligence Estimate.

20 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

Intelligence of the House of Representatives and the

19	SEC. 3. REPORT ON INTELLIGENCE COLLECTION POSTURE
20	AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO AF-
21	GHANISTAN AND RELATED REGION.
22	(a) REPORT.—Not later than 90 days after the date
23	of the enactment of this Act, the Director of National In-
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	telligence, in consultation with the heads of elements of

rector, shall submit to the congressional intelligence com mittees a report on the collection posture of the intel ligence community and other matters relating to Afghani stan and the covered region.

5 (b) MATTERS.—The report under subsection (a) shall6 include the following:

- 7 (1) A detailed description of the collection pos8 ture of the intelligence community with respect to
 9 Afghanistan, including with respect to the following:
 10 (A) The countering of terrorism threats
- that are directed at the United States homeland
 or United States entities abroad.
- (B) The finances of the Taliban, including
 financial contributions to the Taliban from foreign countries (particularly from China, Iran,
 Russia, and any other foreign country in the
 Arab Gulf region (or elsewhere) determined relevant by the Director, respectively).
- (C) The detection, and prevention of, any
 increased threat to the United States homeland
 or United States entities abroad as a result of
 the withdrawal of the United States Armed
 Forces from Afghanistan on August 31, 2021,
 including any such increased threat resulting
 from al-Qaeda or any affiliates thereof, the Is-

lamic State of Iraq and ash Sham-Khorasan or
 any affiliates thereof, or any other similar inter national terrorist group, using Afghanistan as a
 safe harbor.

5 (2) A detailed description of any plans, strate6 gies, or efforts to improve the collection posture de7 scribed in paragraph (1)(A), including by filling any
8 gaps identified pursuant to such paragraph.

9 (3) An assessment of the effect of publicly doc-10 umenting abuses engaged in by the Taliban, and a 11 description of the efforts of the intelligence commu-12 nity to support other departments and agencies in 13 the Federal Government with respect to the collec-14 tion and documentation of such abuses.

(4) An assessment of the relationship between
the intelligence community and countries in the covered region, including an assessment of the following:

19 (A) Intelligence and information sharing20 with such countries.

(B) Any change in the collection posture of
the intelligence community with respect to the
nuclear activities of such countries as a result
of the withdrawal of the United States Armed
Forces from Afghanistan on August 31, 2021.

1 (C) The collection posture of the intel-2 ligence community with respect to the presence 3 of such countries in Afghanistan (including financial contributions to the Taliban, political 4 5 relations with the Taliban, military presence in 6 Afghanistan, economic presence in Afghanistan, 7 and diplomatic presence in Afghanistan) and 8 the understanding of the intelligence community 9 regarding the potential risks, or benefits, of any 10 such presence, contributions, or relations. 11 (D) The ability of the intelligence commu-12 nity to use the airspace of any such countries. 13 (5) An assessment of any financial contribu-14 tions to the Taliban from foreign countries (particu-15 larly from China, Iran, Russia, and any other for-16 eign country in the Arab Gulf region (or elsewhere)

determined relevant by the Director, respectively)
made during the year preceding the withdrawal of
the United States Armed Forces from Afghanistan
on August 31, 2021.

(c) FORM.—The report under subsection (a) may be
submitted in classified form, but shall include an unclassified summary.

24 (d) BIANNUAL UPDATES.—On a biannual basis dur-25 ing the 5-year period following the date of the submission

of the report under subsection (a), the Director of Na tional Intelligence, in consultation with the heads of the
 elements of the intelligence community determined rel evant by the Director, shall submit to the congressional
 intelligence committees an update to such report.
