## A BILL

- To direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services, in cooperation with the Biodefense Steering Committee, to clarify the national biodefense strategy and associated implementation plan, and for other purposes.

  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Responsibility and Ac5 countability in Strategic Pandemic/Biodefense Planning
6 Act of 2020" or the "RASPP Act of 2020".

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## SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION OF NATIONAL BIODEFENSE STRAT EGY.

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and Human Services, in cooperation with the Biodefense 4 5 Steering Committee, shall clarify the national biodefense strategy and associated implementation plan developed 6 7 under section 1086 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2017 (6 U.S.C. 104) to clearly docu-8 9 ment agreed-upon processes, roles, and responsibilities for making and enforcing enterprise-wide decisions. 10

(b) SPECIFIC CLARIFICATIONS.—In carrying out subsection (a), the Secretary of Health and Human Services
shall work with the head of each agency participating in
the Biodefense Steering Committee, including the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency,
to—

17 (1) enter into a memorandum of understanding, 18 or take such other action as is necessary, to describe 19 the roles and responsibilities of the Federal depart-20 ments and agencies, including internal and external 21 coordination procedures, in identifying and sharing 22 information, as described in section 1086(b)(4) of 23 the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal 24 Year 2017 (6 U.S.C. 104(b)(4));

25 (2) clarify roles, responsibilities, and processes
26 for decisionmaking that involves shifting resources

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1	across agency boundaries to more effectively or effi-
2	ciently address enterprise-wide risk;
3	(3) prepare an inventory and assessment of all

4 existing strategies, plans, policies, laws, and inter5 agency agreements with respect to biodefense;

6 (4) establish a resource plan to staff, support,
7 and sustain the efforts of the Biodefense Coordina8 tion Team;

9 (5) clearly document guidance and methods for
10 analyzing the data collected from agencies to include
11 non-Federal resources and capabilities; and

12 (6) not later than 90 days after the date of en-13 actment of this Act, report to the appropriate con-14 gressional committees on possible implementation 15 strategies, that will effectively and efficiently enhance information-sharing activities on biosurveil-16 17 lance data integration as identified in the national 18 biodefense strategy and associated implementation 19 plan described in subsection (a).

20 (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE21 FINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate congres22 sional committees" means the following:
