ICE AURORA CONTRACT DETENTION FACILITY ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT

The Trump Administration informed Congressman Crow's office in February 2025 that it would no longer respond to regular oversight electronic information requests. These requests have been used by Congressman Crow's office under the first Trump Administration and the Biden Administration to complete and corroborate the information provided in these reports, including during the COVID-19 pandemic.

However, as of September 2025, ICE staff will no longer verbally provide information requested by congressional staff during oversight visits for the completion of these regular accountability reports. Congressional staff were instead directed to submit requests for information for the completion of these reports to the ICE Office of Congressional Relations (OCR).

Congressman Crow's staff submitted an electronic information request on June 30, 2026. OCR has not sent over the information requested at this time.

Despite shifting ICE OCR policies, it is a priority for Congressman Crow to provide proper congressional oversight of the Aurora Contract Detention Facility. Congressman Crow and his Congressional office will continue making good-faith efforts to visit the facility and obtain electronic records updates from ICE.

MEDICAL STAFFING:

GEO medical staff said they are fully staffed in the medical section. However, the Congressman's staff were told they would need to reach out to the ICE Office of Congressional Relations to confirm exact staffing data.

MEDICAL NOTES:

- GEO medical staff said there are no communicable diseases in the facility and are continuing to monitor and take extra precautions for any possible outbreaks.
- GEO medical acknowledged that there was a TB scare but stated all detainees tested negative.
- Congressional staff noted that there were five detainees being monitored for medical concerns.

Aurora Fire Rescue confirmed that there were four calls for service responded to at the Aurora Contract Detention Facility (3130 Oakland Street and 11901 E 30th Ave.) between 6/4/26 and 6/18/26. They were as follows:

- 6/7/26 - Unspecified
- 6/12/26 - Medical- Illness
- 6/12/26 - Unspecified
- 6/17/26 - Medical- Illness- Convulsions/Seizures

SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES:

- The contents of this report were derived from an in-person Congressional oversight visit conducted by the staff members of Congressman Crow, Senator Hickenlooper, and Senator Bennet. The visit was conducted at 10 am on June 18th. Staff members provided over 24 hours' notice when sending a request to visit.

Restricted Housing and Law Library

- During the visit, staff members observed that a housing unit that had previously been used for Restricted Housing was repurposed for general population. The pod is now in use but was empty during this visit.
- There were three detainees that staff counted being housed in the Restricted Housing area.
- The law library was not in use during the tour but ICE and GEO staff said that it continued to be used by detainees.

Kitchen and Intake

- Staff entered the kitchen and viewed the refrigerator and storage closet. A GEO staff member showed staff example meals from the past 72 hours. Staff were shown breakfast, lunch, and dinner meals for regular and diet meals. Staff observed lunch meals getting prepared.
- While in the intake area, staff visually counted three detainees in intake.



SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES:

Housing Pods

- Staff entered housing pod A in the main facility, viewing the male “high risk” population pod.
- Each communication board had “voluntary departure” information in 10 languages. There was no longer a dollar amount on the fliers, although ICE staff said that those who qualify for voluntary departure are eligible to receive \$5000. ICE staff could not confirm if those who have elected voluntary departure have ever received the financial compensation.

Annex

- Staff toured the Annex area and counted visually that there were three transgender detainees in the transgender housing pod.
- Transgender detainees were now in pod G on the male side.
- When staff toured the male area within the Annex, they observed that two housing pods were not in use.

Miscellaneous information

- Staff confirmed that the mail MOU is still in place. GEO had released an MOU on how detainees will now receive their mail. Detainees will now be receiving copies of their mail in place of the actual mail. We had followed up with GEO on this and will continue to monitor to make sure that detainees are still receiving their mail.
- Staff toured the soccer field and observed women classified as low-risk playing soccer outside.
- During this visit, ICE and GEO staff were unable to provide fulsome answers to some of the questions contained within this report. Congressman Crow’s staff submitted a written request for information on June 30, 2026.
