A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act to include requirements relating to apprenticeship program assistance for small business development centers, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Small Business Work-
5 force Pipeline Act of 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER APPREN-**
2 **TICESHIP PROGRAM ASSISTANCE.**

3 Section 21(c)(3) of the Small Business Act (15
4 U.S.C. 648(c)(1)) is amended—

5 (1) in subparagraph (T), by striking “and” at
6 the end;

7 (2) in clause (v) of the first subparagraph (U)
8 (relating to succession planning), by striking the pe-
9 riod at the end and inserting a semicolon;

10 (3) in second subparagraph (U) (relating to
11 training on domestic and international intellectual
12 property protections)—

13 (A) in clause (ii)(II), by striking the period
14 at the end and inserting “; and”; and

15 (B) by redesignating such subparagraph as
16 subparagraph (V); and

17 (4) by adding at the end the following new sub-
18 paragraph:

19 “(W) providing information and assistance
20 to small business concerns, including by dis-
21 seminating relevant information from the De-
22 partment of Labor and other Federal agencies,
23 on how to establish and improve—

24 “(i) work-based learning opportunities
25 (as defined in section 3 of the Carl D. Per-

1 kins Career and Technical Education Act
2 of 2006 (20 U.S.C. 2302));

3 “(ii) apprenticeship programs reg-
4 istered under the Act of August 16, 1937
5 (50 Stat. 664, chapter 663; commonly
6 known as the ‘National Apprenticeship
7 Act’; 29 U.S.C. 50 et seq.);

8 “(iii) pre-apprenticeship programs;
9 and

10 “(iv) job training programs.”.
