NOTES:

- The contents of this report were derived from an in-person Congressional oversight visit conducted by the staff members of Congressman Crow, Senator Bennet, and Senator Hickenlooper. The visit was conducted at 12 pm on March 12th.
- Staff members provided 24 hours notice when sending a request to visit.
- Staff visited the ICE Field Office in Centennial to conduct oversight of their processing activities. The processing area has two rooms attached to it visible through glass, each with concrete benches and metal tables for detainees to use while being processed. There is a phone in each room.
- ICE staff said this facility has been in place since 2003.
- ICE staff said the average time individuals are in the processing center is 7 hours.
- Staff asked where detained families wait while processed, and were shown a conference room. ICE Staff said families do not wait more than 12 hours.
- ICE staff said families are often sent to Dilley, TX, or self-deported from Colorado.
