## **SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES:**

Temperatures were in normal range when staff visited.

When our staff visited, we were given a tour by only GEO staff. No ICE staff were present during our tour.

Staff viewed the general population example meals for three days, and they included an entree with a meat protein and sides for each meal. Detainees have access to information on how to request special dietary accommodations in each of the pods near the phones.

The Legal Orientation Program for detainees has been discontinued, although our office is working to see that it resumes. Materials provided by RMAIN through the program are also no longer being distributed to detainees. The new flyers for legal assistance refers detainees to the American Bar Association.

ICE now has documents posted throughout the facility indicating that detainees can elect to be voluntarily removed. These documents do not include the disclaimer that if they choose to self-deport, they will be barred from re-entering the U.S. Depending on the length of time they were unlawfully present in the U.S. prior to self-deporting, they will be barred from re-entry for 3-10 years. Our team raised concerns about these materials with ICE and urged that fulsome, accurate legal information be available to detainees.

GEO installed a cash storage machine where detainees now have the option to deposit any U.S. currency they may have on their person rather than forfeiting that money.

While our office visited on Friday, we observed that ICE was processing deportations in intake to Mexico, Colombia, Peru, Nicaragua, and Venezuela. We were told the number of detainees being deported was 55.

According to GEO staff, outside activity on the field has been halted due to an ongoing investigation into the two detainees who escaped on March 18.
