

ICE AURORA CONTRACT DETENTION FACILITY ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT

Beginning in March 2025, the Trump Administration informed Congressman Jason Crow's office that they will no longer provide electronic files and written updates relevant to the completion of accountability reports detailing conditions at this facility.

Despite this, it is still a priority for Congressman Crow to provide proper congressional oversight of for-profit detention centers, including the Aurora ICE Processing Center. Congressman Crow and his congressional office will continue making good-faith efforts to visit the facility and obtain verbal updates from ICE.

SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES:



On July 14, 2025, Congressman Crow's staff submitted a request to conduct a routine congressional oversight visit on July 17, 2025. Section 527 of Public Law 118-47 states that with respect to staff designated by members to conduct oversight of facilities operated by or for the Department of Homeland Security, "the Department of Homeland Security may require that a request be made at least 24 hours in advance of an intent to enter a facility." This oversight request was denied by the Department of Homeland Security. Please see the Department's reply below:

"Please note the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is now requiring seven calendar days advance notice for visits to DHS detention facilities.

Please see below statement attributable to DHS Assistant Secretary Tricia McLaughlin:

"As ICE law enforcement have seen a surge in assaults, disruptions and obstructions to enforcement, including by politicians themselves, any requests to tour processing centers and field offices must be approved by the Secretary of Homeland Security. These requests must be part of legitimate congressional oversight activities.

As for visits to detention facilities, requests should be made with sufficient time to prevent interference with the President's Article II authority to oversee executive department functions—a week is sufficient to ensure no intrusion on the President's constitutional authority. To protect the President's Article II authority, any request to shorten that time must be approved by the Secretary."

ICE continues to comply with Sec. 527 but entry into detention facilities may be delayed due to exigent circumstances (including personnel and facility security considerations during protests) or time required to vet requests to ensure they for legitimate purposes (i.e., oversight, etc.). ICE will continue to take all actions required to faithfully execute Executive Order 14159, <u>Protecting The American People Against Invasion</u>; we defer additional questions regarding visits to DHS facilities, including questions regarding statement by Secretary Noem, to the Department."
