ICE AURORA CONTRACT DETENTION FACILITY ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT

Beginning in March 2025, the Trump Administration informed Congressman Jason Crow's office that they will no longer provide electronic files and written updates relevant to the completion of accountability reports detailing conditions at this facility.

Despite this, it is still a priority for Congressman Crow to provide proper congressional oversight of for-profit detention centers, including the Aurora ICE Processing Center. Congressman Crow and his congressional office will continue making good-faith efforts to visit the facility and obtain verbal updates from ICE.

MEDICAL NOTES:

There is currently one detainee in the hospital. GEO medical staff informed us that she had arrived at the facility on 7/1 and needed immediate medical attention. The detainee had been transferred from a different ICE facility.

Medical staff confirmed hormone therapy is being provided to transgender detainees as medically determined.

SUPPLEMENTAL NOTES:

Congressman Crow's and Senator Hickenlooper's staff were present for this visit.

Staff noted that the temperature in one of the male housing pods was 80 degrees. Staff will continue an inquiry with GEO and ICE regarding this temperature. Compared to similar months in 2024, this temperature is higher than normal by about 4 degrees.

Staff were given an oversight tour by only GEO staff. No ICE staff were present during the tour despite requesting it with 7 days' notice.

Staff viewed the general population example meals for three days, and they included an entree with a meat protein and sides for each meal. Staff were also shown sample meals for detainees with dietary restrictions. Detainees have access to information on how to request special dietary accommodations in each of the pods near the phones.

The Legal Orientation Program provided by RMIAN has been discontinued. As of July 1, 2025, legal information from RMIAN is once again posted in housing pods.

According to GEO staff, outside activity on the field has been halted due to an ongoing investigation into the two detainees who escaped on March 18. When we asked GEO staff when detainees would be permitted to start using the field again, they estimated that they should be resuming use of the field by the end of July.
