Dear Representative Crow,

I am writing in support of the City of Aurora's FY23 Congressionally Directed Spending request for the *Aurora Public Library* that will activate the lobby and currently empty second floor of the Martin Luther King Library through capital improvements. The project will create a safe place for vulnerable youth and provide a Maker Space and computer lab with 3-D printers, virtual reality technology, a video production lab and camera/microphone/lighting equipment. The Maker Space would focus on high-quality STEM programming and educational opportunities such as learning to code, to use 3-D printers, learning about graphic design, video production and other specialty software all of which are valuable skills that would create otherwise unobtainable career opportunities for disadvantaged youth in Aurora.

Violent crime has been on the rise throughout Aurora, including in the northwest region along Colfax where the MLK Library is located. In the community surrounding the MLK library, the median household income is \$42,800 with 23% of the population living below the poverty line. Of the 20,000 households, 43% have children under the age of 18, 30% of the population over age 25 do not have a high school diploma, and 61% of the population do not have access to the Internet. This project will provide access to computers and the Internet for these populations as well as access to educational resources. The project will also provide an opportunity for youth to connect with positive adult figures that can be a resource for them and youth programming that supports positive risk factors that can prevent them and the community from witnessing or partaking in delinquent or violent behavior.

Our Community Assessment Program provides **free** clinical, bio-psycho-social assessments to school aged youth and families in our community. Upon completion of the assessment process, Clinicians meet with the family and coordinate next steps for connection to resources, services and basic needs that are relevant, attainable, culturally appropriate and financially accessible. We routinely refer young people to pro-social activities in their communities and this program request is exactly the type of resource we are constantly searching for. Our Community Assessment Program has a location within Martin Luther King, Jr Library and being able to refer a young person to an amazing resource like this within the same location, would be amazing and convenient for those we serve.

I strongly urge that Congress includes this Congressionally Directed Spending request for the *Aurora Public Library MLK Branch*.
