We are writing to express my strong support for the City of Littleton’s Mobile Assistance Center initiative and ask that you prioritize moving this request forward through the Community Project Funding process. The City of Littleton is a trusted partner with a proven track record of creating economic opportunity for all Coloradans, especially those residing in the 6th Congressional District. This innovative effort leverages cross-sector partnerships and expertise to advance our shared goal of making Colorado the best state in the country to live and work.

In challenging times, your constituents in Aurora, Littleton, Englewood, and beyond often turn to a government or nonprofit services provider for help; but too often that service provider is too remote, the demand for services is too high, or the web of services is too confusing to navigate. The Mobile Assistance Center solution utilizes a fleet of mobile units (EVs) to deliver the right supports, at the right place, at the right time to those whose access to critical services are limited based on where they live.

Powered by 211 Colorado data insights, these specially equipped vehicles can be strategically deployed to targeted areas throughout CD6. It’s a one-stop shop for almost any type of support or service any family or individual might need. It brings thousands of resources to bear from trusted entities to ensure all constituents, especially those left behind by traditional service delivery offerings or experiencing a disaster, can take the first step on the path towards self-sufficiency. Last year (2025), over 219,000 Coloradans - including thousands in CD6 - were served by 211 and over 399,289 referral connections made to resources like child care, housing support, and food assistance.

The Mobile Assistance Center initiative is uniquely equipped to:

1. Be deployed rapidly in the case of fire or other disaster to help meet immediate and long-term recovery needs of impacted individuals, families, and communities;
2. Work alongside community organizations to fill important resource-connection gaps and maximize local government/nonprofit capacity in your district; and
3. Empower individuals/families with the tools and knowledge to overcome challenges with the support of compassionate, highly trained Resource Specialists and Navigators with access to over 7,000 comprehensive wrap-around services, including tax preparation, physical and mental healthcare referrals, employment supports and workforce development resources, energy and food assistance, and much more.


